Christy Scattarella, Executive Director and founder of *I Can* The Shadow Project spoke this morning on her organization developed to help close the achievement gap for students with complex learning challenges. Just as wheelchair ramps foster independence for persons with physical disabilities, The Shadow Project helps **make learning accessible** for boys and girls whose 'invisible' disabilities include dyslexia, ADHD, autism and communications disorders. They serve 27 Portlandarea schools, providing life-changing classroom enrichment that helps struggling students reach goals and turn **"I can't" into "I can!"**

The Shadow Project partners with special education teachers to help close the achievement gap for students with complex learning challenges. They envision a day when all youngsters with disabilities recognize themselves as capable and courageous, and when no more children give up on school because they feel they can't learn. The Shadow Project provides life-changing enrichment special education teachers use right in their classrooms that helps struggling students grades K-8 reach goals and discover the joy of learning.
