## IMPACT:

Our June program evaluation showed that special education teachers know our program works, reporting 69% of students increased their ability to engage in distance learning, and 82% increased 1-2 grades in reading proficiency.

A CRISIS WITHIN A CRISIS: 80% of Oregon's children with disabilities did not meet reading standards before COVID-19. Now these promising but under-supported students are predicted to "regress even more," according to the Education Civil Rights Alliance. Lifelong negative impacts on their learning and wellbeing are expected to be profound, especially for Black, Latinx and Indigenous students with disabilities, who face the double barriers of ableism and racism and who comprise 35% of the students we serve. For students of color with disabilities, this is a crisis within a crisis. We have been profoundly impacted by calls for racial justice, and will deepen our work to support this movement. We will seek to advance equity for BIPOC students and communities of color by partnering with schools that have shared interest in ending systemic inequity through trauma-informed, strengths-based approaches. We will strengthen our collaboration with BIPOC educators, parents, and community members to prioritize the voices of those who have long been ignored as leaders for change.

As part of our commitment to advancing equity for diverse learners, we work to recruit and retain a diverse staff, volunteers, and board—one that welcomes and engages people with diverse, intersectional identities.
