Turning "I Can't" into "I Can!"

In Oregon, just 40% of students in special education graduate in four years, with a standard diploma. Discouraged by their social and academic struggles, and often ostracized by their peers for being "different," these capable learners give up hope of success in school, quadrupling their risk of drop out. **But with the right support, these promising students can become persistent, engaged learners.**

The Shadow Project makes school more accessible and engaging for children with learning challenges so they can achieve their full potential. Since 2003, the Portland-based nonprofit has teamed with teachers to unleash the potential of nearly 12,500 children in grades K-8. *Because every child deserves dignity, respect, and the opportunity to thrive*.

Motivation and Engagement

We equip special education teachers with a structured social emotional support system filled with powerful tools and techniques to build students' internal motivation, maintain high expectations, and empower k-8 students to be confident, engaged learners. Through daily activities, kids develop persistence, autonomy, and a growth mindset.

Engagement, Autonomy, & Perseverance in School

Program outcomes include:

- 89% of students say Goal Setting motivates them to keep trying, even when school is difficult.
- 74% of teachers say the program significantly enhances their ability to reach disengaged learners.
- 93% of teachers increased teaching time, due to increased student buy-in to learning goals and classroom expectations.
